RESOLUTION 2020-0204

A RESOLUTION TO APPROVE LEAF AND LIMB GUIDELINES

WHEREAS, the Town of West Pelzer desires to maintain clean streets, free of debris, yard waste, and trash; and

WHEREAS, the Town of West Pelzer began a Leaf and Limb Pick-Up Pilot program for three (3) months in November 2018; and

WHEREAS, the Town of West Pelzer has and will continue to provide pick-up for reasonable quantities of yard waste as defined; and

WHEREAS, the Town of West Pelzer will continue to schedule annual pick-up through our regular service provider for household garbage or other materials; and

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE TOWN OF WEST PELZER, THAT:

- The town shall collect reasonable quantities of yard waste, as defined below, during the third
 week of each month or at such times and dates as shall be set by the mayor. All pick-ups must be
 scheduled by submitted a work order in person (30 Main Street), over the phone (864-947-6297),
 or by using the online portal.
- All yard waste must be placed at the front curb or edge of a parcel near the road, unobstructed by fences, poles, vehicles, signs or similar objects, no earlier than 24 hours prior to a scheduled yard waste collection week.
- No other refuse or foreign materials, including but not limited to, paper, cans, flower pots, metal, string, or glass, shall be mixed with any yard waste.
- Leaves and grass clippings to be picked up shall be enclosed in plastic bags, securely tied and placed in a separate pile from other yard waste and any other refuse.
- Only tree limbs that are up to six inches in diameter (no longer than six feet in length), shall be
 picked up during the designated times. Tree limbs greater than six inches in diameter shall be kept
 in separate piles than any limbs less than six inches in diameter and any other yard waste.
- No pile of yard waste shall be more than four feet in height and ten feet in width. When it is
 required to have more than one pile, there must be at least two feet of space between each pile.
- The town shall not collect unreasonable amounts of yard waste, such as lot clearing, cutting of trees and large stumps. The disposal of such yard waste shall be the responsibility of the property owner or other person in use or control of the property.
- The town shall not collect construction and demolition materials, household garbage, hazardous materials, or other metals, tires, etc. The town will continue to schedule yearly pick-up through our regular service provider for the aforementioned materials.
