- New stop signs were installed at Holiday St & Marguerite St. We are seeing generally good compliance with the three-way stop. We are currently just issuing warnings for those who disregard it. Regular enforcement actions will begin effective December 18th, after giving motorists a month to get used to the new signs being in place. In addition to the signs, public works painted stop lines, installed orange flags, and advanced warning signs, all to improve motorist awareness and safety.
