Resolution 2023-0314 "A RESOLUTION TO MAKE HINDMNAN STREET ONE-WAY FROM MAIN STREET TO THE PUBLIC PARKING ENTRANCE (TMS 2430406017)"

Clerk's Comments: Hindman Street is a street that the Council has authority to modify; Designating Hindman Street as one-way from Main Street to the public parking entrance will not impede traffic and make its intersections safer to thru-traffic, walkers and visitors to downtown. Mayor Sanders added that this would not be effective until July 1, 2023. Councilman Lee made a motion to approve, 2nd by Councilman Riddle; all were in favor.

A RESOLUTION TO MAKE HINDMAN STREET ONE-WAY FROM MAIN STREET TO THE PUBLIC PARKING ENTRANCE (TMS 2430406017)

WHEREAS, the Town of West Pelzer's Code of Ordinances provides the power of Council to designate through streets, stop streets, one-way streets and make other modifications to the Town's road system; and

WHEREAS, Hindman Street are streets Town Council has the authority to modify; and

WHEREAS, the Town of West Pelzer believes designating Hindman Street one-way from Main Street to the public parking entrance (TMS 2430406017) will not impede traffic and make its intersections safer to thru-traffic, walkers, and visitors to downtown; and

WHEREAS, the one-way of Hindman Street will be completed through proper signage and improvements as provided by the guidelines as established in the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) provided by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA); and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL OF WEST PELZER, SOUTH CAROLINA: The Town of West Pelzer agrees to make Hindman Street one way from Main Street to the public parking entrance (TMS 2430406017). The one way signage for the new flow will be installed upon approval of Council and completed no later than July 1, 2023.

AN ORDINANCETO PROVIDE FOR THE ADOPTION OF AN OPERATING BUDGET, ITS EXECUTION AND EFFECT, FOR THE FISCAL PERIOD JULY 1, 2023 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2024

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF WEST PELZER, SOUTH CAROLINA:

SECTION 1. In accordance with The Code of Ordinances for the Town of West Pelzer, South Carolina, there is hereby adopted for the fiscal period July 1, 2023 to June 30, 2024, an operating budget for the Town of West Pelzer, South Carolina, based on budget estimates of various funds as prepared by the Mayor and incorporated into the FY 2023-2024 operating budget document, and as modified by the attached adjustment schedule.

SECTION 2. The total revenues and expenditures for the fiscal period are estimated as follows:


SECTION 3. A bound copy of the budget containing detailed schedules which support the appropriations set forth in Section 2, above, shall be attested by the Mayor and maintained as an official record in the office of the Mayor and Town Clerk.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall become effective upon date of passage, designated as Ordinance No. 2022-0510. Subsequent review of revenues and expenditures occurs daily, weekly, and monthly; a review of revenues and expenditures will occur by council biannually.




- Local economy is booming!
- Property tax revenues improved well above projections.
- Water revenues and collections remained stable and reserves increased with contractual buy-out of Greenville Water.
- Reduced expenditures across the board for 7 straight years.
- Utilization of Tranche 1 American Rescue Plan funds to recover and improve community.
- Minimize financial burden on residents (no change to tax rate, water/sewer rates/sanitation)

Revenue Sources

- **45.8%** General Fund
 (Property taxes, business license, franchise fees, Local Government Fund) and Hospitality Fund (2% on Prepared Food)
- **54.2%** Utility Fund (Water, Sewer, Sanitation)

- 3% COLA
